REMOVAL FROM ATAS DIRECTORY

The business will be removed from that ATAS Business Directory, relied on by consumers to find a reputable travel business.



LOSS OF ACCESS TO EXCLUSIVE INSURANCE PREMIUMS*

Access to exclusive rates on both Professional Indemnity and Public Liability Insurance Premiums will be disabled.

LOSS OF DISPUTE RESOLUTION MEDIATION ACCESS
